

What is RYLA?

RYLA is an intensive training program for young community leaders. Young people chosen for their leadership potential attend an all-expenses-paid experience to explore leadership skills and to practice those skills through application. Individual Rotary Clubs select the participants, pay their expenses, and insure transportation to and from RYLA.

RYLA's Core Curriculum includes . . .

Fundamentals of leadership Ethics of positive leadership Importance of communication skills in effective leadership Problem solving and conflict management Rotary's purpose and service to the community Building self-confidence and self esteem Elements of community and global citizenship

About RYLA Seminars . . .

During this intensive program, keynote speakers from various professions, and perhaps even a few Rotarians, address the participants on issues that are particularly relevant to the development of strong personal and leadership qualities. Much time is devoted to activities that provide for participants to get to know each other and to work together on group projects. Evenings are devoted to various entertainments, such as recreational activities and social events.

The program will be directed by Rotary professionals, who are assisted by qualified educators. In addition, lectures and discussions will be presented by experts and leaders in various aspects of the community.
